OBJECTIVES	- Examination of the main elements related to the kenotic theology of the most important Russian thinkers of the nineteenth and twentieth centuries, including Vladimir Soloviev, Mikhail Tareev, Metropolitan Anthony Khrapovitsky, Sergius Bulgakov, Vladimir Lossky, Georges Florovsky and Sophrony Sakharov which serve as the background of Anthony Bloom's kenotic theology. - Kenotic theology of Anthony Bloom: God-forsakenness of Christ; anthropology; kenosis in Church and Sacraments; God's faith in a human being; kenosis in relationship with God, other person and oneself.
