DESCRIPTION	The Eastern Churches and ecclesial communion. Historical development of the canonical tradition of the Eastern Churches, both Orthodox and Catholic. The teaching of Vatican II and postconciliar documents on the Eastern Churches. The Code of Canons of the Eastern Churches. General principles of Eastern Catholic canon law with particular reference to the dispensing authority of ordinaries. Ecclesial institutions: eparchies, parishes. General principles of Eastern sacramental legislation.
OBJECTIVES	Students will be introduced to the study of Canon Law and its sources Students will explore canonical collections from both Byzantine and non-Byzantine authors with a special emphasis on primary sources Students will explore the process of codification in the Catholic Church as a response to the challenges of using historical legislation as a system of law. Students will gain a critical overview of the structure and content of the CCEO
