





Sheptytsky Institute Publications Sales

For years, the Sheptytsky Institute has been hoping to make available online its sizeable stock of publications and other products. Thanks to the tireless work of William Szuch, the hope was finally realized this year.

In late-June 2018 MASI guietly unveiled a no-frills shopping cart for its Web site (https://www.sheptytskyinstitute.ca/). The first online sale - \$30 for Pray for God's Wisdom by Fr. Chirovsky - was received from California on June 28. In less than ten months since (28 June 2018 - 14 April 2019) the MASI Web site received 105 orders for 266 items generating \$8,482 in revenue.


Products sold include 148 books, 33 journals, 12 journal subscriptions, 52 CDs, 15 DVDs, 3 poster sets, and 3 card sets. Orders were received from Canada (6 provinces), U.S.A. (30 states), UK, Sweden, Denmark, Finland, Romania, Australia, and Puerto Rico.

In addition to seeing record Web site traffic, MASI was on track to pass \$10,000 in online sales within its first 12 months of operation. Unfortunately, the shopping cart was suspended by PayPal on April 14-15 due to technical difficulties.

Despite this temporary setback, MASI has proven that selling publications through its Web site directly to customers reveals a greater demand for its inventory of scholarly publications than previously believed. As a result, the Institute has a small, but new and growing revenue stream.

Owning and controlling its own online shopping cart provides MASI several advantages: monetization of inventory, reduction in inventory, full ownership of sales revenue, control and flexibility over pricing and sales, elimination of expensive distribution costs which typically consume 40-60% of gross revenue.

Presently, less than one-quarter of MASI's entire catalogue is offered online for sale. The addition of further titles should grow Web sales. Future expansion of this new revenue stream include selling direct digital downloads files of the entire LOGOS catalogue In sum, MASI could realistically expect to generate as much as \$20K in annual Web sales revenue.
